## 2011 Artist Profiles

Virginia Schenck, www.airborneecstasy.com, is a nationally recognized singer, teacher, and music therapist who uses the power of music and improvisational singing to bring joy, connection, healing, and profound learning to the human experience. Virginia's work draws on extensive training in therapeutic modalities, lifelong musical study, and a searching and ever-deepening spirituality. Her most recent accomplishments include an inaugural healing conference at Kanuga (NC) Episcopal Retreat Center, the Singing Darwin project, and Circle Songs under the tutelage of Bobby McFerrin.

"Everyone needs music. As ancient civilizations remind us, the Hopi, Aboriginal, and Egyptian cultures proclaim in their mythologies 'sound generates life.' Sound is certainly in our bones."

installation, *penetralia*, was commissioned as a sculpture garden for Lenox Park in Atlanta, and her recent solo show at Galerie Gigi in the New Orleans French Quarter paralleled the harlequin with redemptive aspects of the sacred feminine.

Diane's work is powerfully linked to the narrative form and the construction of testaments which reflect her personal journey as poet and therapist, juxtaposing revelations of the soul's depth and breadth.

"Everything I create is cloaked in mystery. For me, the holy is mystery. Whatever emerges in my work through the written word, paint, clay, and through relationship emerges from the holy mystery in a process of discovery."

"Rope sculptures are each Kundalini manifestations of our own infinity on earth. From my child-hood spent with ropes on boats along the waterways of Holland to sailing amidst the salt encrusted ropes washed ashore in Maine, living and working with rope has been a lifelong experience."
